Wilson County 4-H Shooting Sports Tournament Eligibility Policy and Procedures

In order for a 4-Her, competing in the Wilson County 4-H Shooting Sports Program, he/she must gain eligibility to compete at a tournament. He/she must complete the following activities outlined in this document:

Choose ONE of the following or come up with your own event/activity to participate in; these are just examples (doesn't necessarily have to be related to shooting sports; it can be anything in 4-H within your county, district, region, or state):

- Complete a project record book and submit for county judging in January
- Club/County level public speaking
- Club/County level presentation/demonstration
- Attend instructor training (must be at least 16 years old)
- Participate in a fundraiser set by the club
- Attend 3 County Council meetings
- Serve as a teen volunteer during the Summer Fun camps
- Be active on the county, district or state youth councils (County Council, Southeast District Officer, NC officer)

MUST DO/COMPLETE the following (not an option):

- Participate in a minimum of 1 community service project (club or county 4-H project),
- Register to help set-up and take down practice equipment at least 3 times each season, and
- Attend a minimum of 7 practices (if you practice with a school team, you must have that instructor send in the attendance record each month to the club leader and 4-H agent).
- If you do not live in Wilson County, you must complete a Declaration of Intent to Compete in a County of Non-Residence.

**Club leaders will keep a record of each 4-Hers' activities and submit attendance/activity sheets to the 4-H office.

These sheets will be used to determine if a 4-Her is eligible to compete at the Regional and State tournament. Any acts violating the 4-H Code of Conduct or Shooting Sports rules/regulations will forfeit a 4-H member's eligibility.

PLEASE NOTE:

If you are a 4-H'er who does not complete the above activities to receive tournament eligibility, you will not be able to compete at the Regional and State 4-H Tournaments.

If you live in Wilson County and wish to compete in another county, you must complete a Declaration of Intent to Compete in a County of Non-Residence. This form must be signed by the 4-H agent in the county you live, and the 4-H agent in the county you want to compete in. The 4-H'er, having signed the Non-Residence form, will not be eligible to compete for any other county for the time frame stated on the Non-Residence form. The calendar year will run from January 1- December 31. The Wilson County 4-H Shooting Sports Eligibility Policy and Procedures were made effective in January, 2018.
